## Quinn Stevenson Memorial Rink is Now Open!

### Family/Public Skate times:

Mondays and Wednesdays, 4pm-6pm  
Saturdays 10am-12pm.

### Rink Rules:

- Have fun and be respectful.
- **No sticks during family/public skating times or learn to skate programs.**
  - Respect the rink skating schedule as posted.
  - Spend a few minutes scraping the ice.
  - Shovel snow OVER the boards. When shoveled snow is left against the boards, it turns ice solid and the volunteer crew is getting too old to shovel hard now.
- Always leave the place cleaner than you found it. Don't leave garbage and if you see some, please pick it up. There are garbage cans outside and inside the warm-up rink.
- Children and inexperienced skaters should use an approved helmet while on the ice to prevent injuries.
  - Do not use the rink during unusually warm weather.
  - Stay off the ice surface while it's being resurfaced.

**Parents, please share these rules with your kids if they frequent the ice as few follow our Facebook page.

### PRINCIPAL POINTS FROM FATHER ROBINSON SCHOOL

This fall at École Father Robinson School has been both busy and beautiful. As a school community, we have continued to place a strong focus on social-emotional learning. In September, students spent time learning about emotions and building the language needed to better describe how they are feeling. In October, classes learned and practised four key regulation strategies to help support self-awareness and emotional balance.

Throughout November, students learned about several different Saints, reflecting on how they made a difference in the world and how they faced challenges with faith, courage, and compassion. These lessons provided meaningful connections between our Catholic faith and everyday life.

As we moved into December, we joyfully celebrated the season of Advent together. Our students participated in a variety of special events, including a high-energy Gym Blast for Grades 5-8, a Christmas evening event for our Kindergarten families, a Carol Concert for Grades 1-4, and a beautiful liturgy and band concert. What a busy and lovely fall it has been!

When we return in January, we will continue our work with social-emotional learning by focusing once again on additional regulation strategies to support student well-being.



We are also excited to be working on designing new logos for our house leagues, along with a central logo representing our amazing Raptors community.

As the new principal since September, it has truly been a joy getting to know the students, families, and staff of École Father Robinson School. I feel so blessed to be part of such a welcoming, supportive, and faith-filled community.

For decades, individuals and families have benefited from their compassionate and high-quality supports, and we look forward to continuing our shared efforts to build a more inclusive Saskatchewan.
